

SST Early Childhood Education Grand Opening

SeacoastSchool of Technology officially opened the doors to the newly-renovated Early Childhood Education Program and Wright Start Preschool

A special Ribbon Cutting Ceremony and Open House took place Monday, November 19th as the Seacoast School of Technology in Exeter officially opened its newly renovated Early Childhood Education Program and Wright Start Preschool. The Open House hours were from 8:00 am – 2:00 pm and many parents, former students, and community members toured the new classrooms and preschool. At 11:30 am, SST Principal Margaret Callahan hosted local and state school dignitaries for a special Ribbon Cutting Ceremony celebrating the first phase of SST's 8.5 million dollar renovation project.

Highlights of the new Early Childhood Education renovation include expanded classroom, office, and storage space. A new student computer area, work space and preschool observation room have also been added. The new Wright Start Preschool has a number of exciting features. Visitors during the Open House saw a dynamic and unique design for the SST students and children. A separate entrance and convenient parent drop-off area have been completed. Preschool features include new circle and play spaces, a larger children's entrance and welcoming area, a new kitchen and snack area, and new bathrooms. A very special "play castle" has been built as the centerpiece of the new preschool. A new outdoor play area will be completed in the spring.

The renovation of the Seacoast School of Technology will include new facilities and upgrades to all of SST's 13 Career & Technical programs. Majority funding for the SST Renovation Project is being provided through State of New Hampshire school construction funds. SST serves students from Epping, Exeter, Great Bay eLearning Charter, Newmarket, Raymond, Sanborn Regional, and Winnacunnet high schools.
